Dear Dr. Cohen:

I wish to offer my sincere congratulations on your new appointment as the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). You are filling an essential role at an agency that has a wide-ranging impact on the nation's health. National Nurses United (NNU), representing nearly 225.000 members nationwide, is the largest labor union and professional association for registered nurses (RNs) in the United States. As RNs, our members recognize the role that CDC's guidance plays in shaping essential policy, including those concerning health care infection control, patient safety, and chronic and infectious disease prevention.

We are eager to meet with you at your earliest convenience to discuss a variety of issues related to the nursing workforce and patient care. Chief among them is our deep concern about proposals to weaken the CDC's guidance for infection control in health care settings. Recently, the CDC's Healthcare Infection Control Practices Advisory Committee (HICPAC) initiated a process to update health care infection control guidance relied on extensively by the agency. Both the available content of these updates and the process to develop them are troubling. As RNs, our members are patient advocates who have developed expertise on the infection control and occupational protection measures necessary to ensure the safe delivery of patient care. Their concerns for their safety and the safety of their patients have not been considered sufficiently by HICPAC/CDC.

Your prompt attention to this matter is crucial. It was announced at the June 2023 HICPAC meeting that final language would be presented to the committee for a vote at the August 2023 meeting. This represents a problematic acceleration of the timeline that was presented by HICPAC/CDC staff earlier in the year.<sup>1</sup> HICPAC/CDC Workgroup presentations indicate an effort to weaken existing protections for health care workers caring for patients with infectious diseases. The scientific research base and the loss of RN lives during the pandemic demonstrate that stronger infection control measures are needed. The CDC and HICPAC must hear from and incorporate input from our members, who are direct care RNs, before finalizing these updates, but they have no clear mechanism to do so.

I am attaching background and analysis of the situation and look forward to a meeting with you to discuss this further. Given the seriousness of the situation and the significant impact such updates will have on our membership, we stand ready and willing to meet with you in person at the earliest opportunity.
