Discussion Summary

Public HICPAC meeting (8/22) debrief

- The Committee and others were in support of the proposed language for Enhanced Barrier Precautions (EBP).
- There was also a discussion on and support for defining a safe zone as designated bed space vs. entry into the patient's room in order to expand to other settings.
- The history of Standard Precautions was reviewed at the meeting, and the Committee was asked if anything should be changed.
 - Most were concerned about not losing any elements of Standard Precautions.
 - A member noted that Core Practices will be the primary home for Standard Precaution moving forward and not the updated Isolation Guideline.

Workgroup/NIOSH meeting (8/17) debrief

- A workgroup (WG) member asked for clarification on whether ventilation would be in this update or if this update would point to that topic within the Environmental Guidelines as previously discussed.
 - This update will link to the environmental guidelines, but members agreed with the comments from NIOSH that some clarifying information could be added to this update.
 - The NIOSH attendees were concerned about the discussions around renaming Airborne Infection Isolation Rooms (AIIR) and felt that was not in the purview of this update.
 - WG members agreed it may cause confusion to change the name but also discussed adding some clarifying language when referring to AIIR, such as "for containment of air in the space."
 - A comment was made that people who manage Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) infrastructure will also refer to this, so the information might need to go beyond what frontline users alone would want.
- The group discussed being thoughtful about communicating the evidence that will support updated recommendations.
 - WG members agreed there needs to be clarification that the literature review shouldn't be over-interpreted to mean that we equate medical/surgical masks with N95 respirators.
 - When evidence reviews and tables are presented, the group agreed more context needs to be given to avoid future confusion.

- There needs to be more clarification that Part II will be an update of Appendix A and will go pathogen by pathogen.
- The group plans to continue to consult with NIOSH as needed to help identify what needs to stay in this update and what needs to be linked to other guidelines.

Guideline – Discussion about new recommendation-based format and how to incorporate evidence

- The group discussed formatting the document and pulling recommendations into clearly defined recommendation sections.
 - The proposed format will have short narrative sections following the recommendation sections.
- The group agreed with the proposed format.
- The group discussed how evidence will be presented to support new recommendations.
 - Members discussed the HICPAC Categorization Scheme (<u>Update to the Recommendation</u> <u>Categorization Scheme | HICPAC | CDC</u>).

Standard Precautions

• Changing the name of Standard Precautions was discussed at the August HICPAC meeting; in general, Committee members did not favor changing the name.
