## **Impacts of Economic Inequality on Women's Health (Course Number 01:988:408)**

Domestic and global economic inequality places significant numbers of people at high risk for health crises even as they are denied access to care. This course investigates the "pathogenic" aspects of economic inequality. It examines how systems of unequal resource distribution contribute to wide disparities of health risk, access to healthcare, and clinical outcomes. It explores how global trade and transnational migration affect health costs, healthcare delivery systems, and the availability of healthcare professionals. By tracing links between macro-economic policies and access to healthcare, the course analyzes pathologies suffered by individual women in the context of structural violence.
