CERTIFICATE PROGRAM IN WOMEN’S GLOBAL HEALTH LEADERSHIP

The first-ever, accredited, online, university program focused on bedside nurse values and leadership.

This one-of-a-kind program is designed to bring RN assessment skills and the art of patient advocacy to bear on the political and economic causes of global health disparity.

Online courses provide a truly global and intergenerational learning experience. Students in the program include full-time health care professionals seeking to better understand the broader social and historical context of health and health care and undergraduates exploring futures in academic, advocacy, and health-related careers.

All classes in this program can be taken individually and/or used toward the completion of a certificate in Women’s Global Health Leadership.

🎓 Five Class Certificate Requirements

- » Two required core classes
- » Three elective courses of your choosing
- » Maintain a 3.0 grade point average in the program

SCHOLARSHIPS

All National Nurses United members are eligible to apply for FULL or PARTIAL tuition and books scholarships.

- » Scholarships are awarded on a course-by-course basis. RNs are not required to enroll in the entire five course certificate program to receive a class scholarship.
- » Some employment-based education benefits cover all or part of the cost of courses. Please contact us if you would like help in pursuing this option.
